Prepare for CNS certification

UB's master's degree in Human Nutrition prepares you for the Certified Nutrition Specialist (CNS) certification. Our program features a unique capstone experience — the Virtual Clinic, where you will gain clinical management experience and eligibility for 200-255 hours of supervised fieldwork credits toward the CNS credential. The first of its kind in the world, the Virtual Clinic allows you to work with professional clinicians and faculty members to perform virtual nutritional exams and consultations — helping you gain the experience necessary to achieve a rewarding career in the field. Graduates from UB's MS in Human Nutrition program find fulfilling professional roles in private nutritional practices, functional medicine clinics, community health organizations, and more!

Program prerequisites

- Bachelor's degree from an accredited institution
- Cumulative GPA of 2.75 or higher

Depending on your undergraduate background, you may be required to take up to 9 credits of graduate-level courses in Anatomy and Physiology, Biochemistry, and Nutrition. These courses are all offered at the start of the program — you can apply with or without them completed!

- Official transcripts from all schools attended
- Personal statement
 - Please discuss (in approximately 500 words) your specific interests and goals within the field of nutrition and your ability to thrive in a rigorous academic environment, including your strengths and potential challenges. Your essay will be evaluated on writing ability as well as specific, original content addressing each aspect of the prompt.

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
